Kara is experienced in supporting clients with complex orthopaedic injuries, including amputation; she has an in-depth knowledge of the available facilities and resources in order to support her clients in maximising their rehabilitation potential.

As well as her physiotherapy training, Kara is also a highly-trained, experienced Case Manager. She is particularly skilled at helping her clients psychologically, assisting them to mentally adjust to their injury as well as being highly skilled in helping them to overcome the day-to-day challenges they are presented with. Example of client goal achievement: *"I was delighted to have worked within and coordinated a team of professionals to enable an elderly client to return home for the first time since his accident in time for Christmas. The client had been in a nursing home and then a rehabilitation unit for a period of around a year since discharge from his specialist centre and required a new accessible property, a full 24-hour care package, specialist equipment and a community therapy team. We identified a property which needed adaptations and were told that it would potentially take twelve weeks to complete. My client's goal, and that of his family was for him to be in the property for Christmas – eleven weeks away. I successfully managed to ensure a safe discharge from the rehabilitation unit into the property with all adaptations completed and a full care team in place, with all appropriate equipment on the date of planned discharge – 21 December. The family had their first family Christmas together since the accident."*

National Spinal Injuries Centre, Stoke Mandeville Hospital – Specialist Physiotherapist – June 2004 – October 2013

Worked with a wide variety of patients across varying level of injuries, of different ages and pre-injury ability. Worked with ventilated patients, paediatrics and adolescents and those aging with a spinal cord injury.

- Assessed posture and seating requirements, made seating recommendations and liaised with Wheelchair Services ensuring appropriate seating equipment was provided
- Participated in 'rotations' within the Centre gaining experience in splinting, hydrotherapy, acute management and readmissions
- Completed audit and delivered training to peers and external professionals
- Worked with a small multidisciplinary focus group to devise and deliver a new two-day course for external candidates on sexuality and fertility after spinal cord injury
- Provided supervision and training for junior members of the team and students. Acted as a clinical educator for physiotherapy students
- Involved with sport as a basis of rehabilitation and participated as a supporting team member in the Inter Spinal Unit Games in 2006. Took non-participating patients to the games every year enabling them to experience a variety of sports that is available to those with disabilities, both competitively and non-competitively
